<u>Agenda Item #5 – Consider Awards for Six Projects Specified in Memoranda of</u> <u>Understanding with Ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles</u>

Cynthia Ravenstein, MSRC Contracts Administrator, explained that in August 2024, the MSRC approved Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with the Ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles. Those MOUs established frameworks that allow those Ports to invest their clean truck fund rate proceeds in heavy duty zero emission drayage truck charging infrastructure projects that would be administered by the MSRC. The MOUs specified projects that had been submitted in response to the MSRC's RFI that was released in 2022. To administer these projects, the MSRC needs to authorize awards to the ultimate funding recipients. Staff is asking the MSRC-TAC to consider making a recommendation of specific funding awards to the recipients are Clean Energy, TeraWatt and Forum Mobility. In the time since TeraWatt submitted their original RFI response,

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they've had some changes. Some of the locations are going to have a larger number of charging stalls and some are going to have a fewer number of charging stalls than what was originally specified in the MOUs. That will result in pro-rated award amounts for TeraWatt and the maximum award amount to TeraWatt would be decreased from \$8,000,000 to \$6,785,714. The total funding amount for the three awards would be \$15,950,868.

MSRC-TAC Chair Minh Le asked if any of the participants have an overlap with other grants. Ravenstein stated that she does believe that these projects have been seeking other funding, but they are required to have a minimum amount of their own funding going in.

MSRC-TAC Alternate Lorelle Moe-Luna asked to clarify that the agreement and the MOUs are with the MSRC and the Ports, and whether the three recipients would receive funds directly from the MSRC or from another source. Ravenstein stated that technically the MOUs are between the Ports and South Coast AQMD on behalf of the MSRC. The Ports are going to transfer funding to the South Coast AQMD. There will be a request for South Coast AQMD to create a new special fund to hold this money. The payments will be made from that fund to these recipients.

Moved by Cardoso, seconded by Moe-Luna (alt) to recommend approval as recommended; item unanimously approved.

This includes tax code changes which will change many agencies' trajectories in terms of making progress towards zero emission transportation. Chair Le encouraged the organizations to work with their legislative teams.

Cynthia Ravenstein, MSRC Contracts Administrator, welcomed new MSRC-TAC alternates, Mairany Anaya from the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority and Hanan Sawalha from RCTC. Ravenstein also introduced a new MSRC Contracts Assistant, Jamie Sellers.
